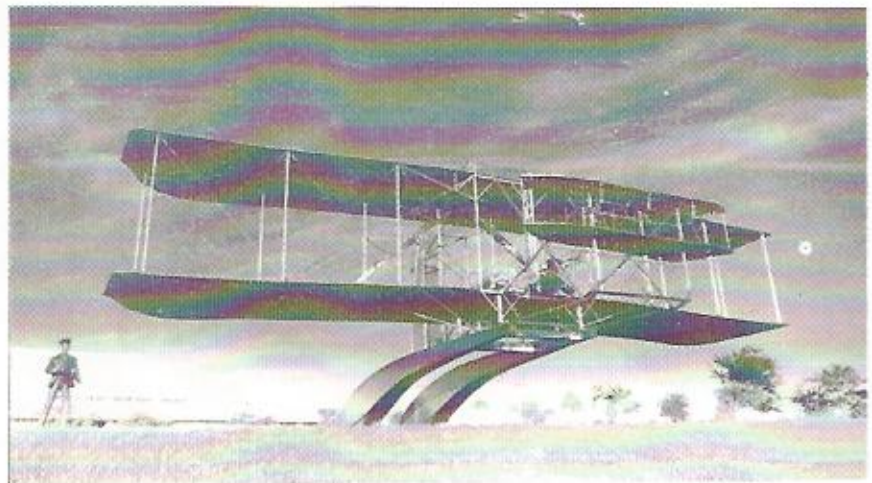

Another added feature is the replica of the Wright Flyer with Orville and Wilber. The Wright Flyer is located in front of the Jack Hunt Memorial Library and was erected by donations, one of which included Delta Chi brother John Mazur and his family. The school is also undergoing a transition in aircraft used for flight training. The Piper Cadet is slowly replacing the ageless C-172, and the Mooney M20J has replaced the C-172RG.
